Fond Memories





I grew up hearing about the work of our Scudder family in India, always inspired by their commitment to help people in need, working alongside devoted Indian colleagues.

As a young psychology intern in 1984, I traveled to CMC Vellore and worked at Nambikkai Nilayam, a center for the evaluation and training of children with intellectual disabilities.

Nambikkai Nilayam, a Tamil phrase, means "center of hope." It was and remains just that.

While there, I also represented the Scudder Association at a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Medical Officers' Quarters at Scudder Memorial Hospital in Ranipet.



Nambikkai Nilayam is now larger, focusing on neurodevelopmental conditions such as autism, cerebral palsy, and other learning disabilities.

Twice a Scudder, one of our historian's favorite ancestors



GENERAL WILLIAM SCUDDER STRYKER

One of Trenton's most respected Scudders was Gen. William Scudder Stryker, veteran of the Civil War. In one battle, "he was dispatched with orders to a distant point. The way was swept by a storm of shot and shell from the rebel batteries, but [he] calmly galloped through it all, delivered his message, and returned in safety," while thousands on both sides breathlessly watched his bravery.

He was named Adjutant-General of New Jersey on April 12, 1867. He served in that office for over thirty-three years until his death on 29 October 1900. In 1898, he published his monumental work, The Battles of Trenton and Princeton. From 1884, as President of the Trenton Battle Monument Association, he oversaw the erection of the monument, dedicated 19 October 1893.

Construction is nearly complete on a new staff headquarters building that will replace a leaky antiquated facility. The new buildings will house 16 doctors and nurses and their families.





WALTER SCUDDER SCHOOL.

Construction is moving ahead to complete the Gordon Sherman Boys Hostel. The facility will allow 90 boys from distant villages a chance to get the 11th and 12th grade education that will make them college-eligible and help them get good jobs.


